- "Wonder" by R. J. Palacio (fiction; about a boy born with a medical condition learning to get along in the world while other people learn to treat him with compassion)
- "The Graveyard Book" by Neil Gaiman (fantasy; about a young orphan being raised by ghosts and other creatures)
- "Boy" by Roald Dahl (a humorous autobiographical retelling of this author's childhood)
- "My Sister Lives on the Mantlepiece" by Annabel Pitcher (fiction; about a young boy whose sister was killed in a terrorist attack)
- "Bruised" by Siobhán Parkinson (fiction; about a teenage boy from Dublin who must figure out how to care for and protect his younger sister from their mother)
- "Inkheart" by Cornelia Funke (fantasy; about a girl who discovers her father has an unusual power, resulting in strange and dangerous people entering their world)
- "The Hunger Games" by Suzanne Collins (dystopian fiction, about a teenage girl who enters a deadly competition so that her sister won't have to)
